Since the Stones' cover-version of **Money** (included in the UK) was already available here as the B-side to **I Wanna Be Your Man**, it was replaced here with **Good Times, Bad Times**, the UK & US-B-side to **It's All Over Now**. The cover of the groups' 1st LP was also used here for the EP-sleeve. First copies have the wording "HI-FI" printed on the back, later ones don't!

Comments: A unique compilation. The original B-side to **It's All Over Now**, **Good Times, Bad Times** had been just included on an EP, so **Tell Me**, the only Jagger/Richard composition from the groups' debut LP was chosen for the flipside. A slightly longer version of the song, clocking in at 4:06, was used here. This very same version was also available in the USA, but not in Britain. This was the fourth and last single that originally appeared with a solid gold Decca logo on the

labels. During the next three years, the record was available in almost every different Stones standard sleeve that German Decca had to offer. It was first re-issued in November 1964 with the "1st LP"-cover, then, in October 1965, with a picture-sleeve based on the "GOT LIVE IF YOU WANT IT" EP-cover-design (see ILLUSTRATED Great Britain discography) and, one last time, in spring 1967 with the so-called "stairs" cover. By then, the wine red labels featured a boxed Decca-logo. Please note the mis-spelling of the A-side on a rare first issue of the "stairs" cover.
