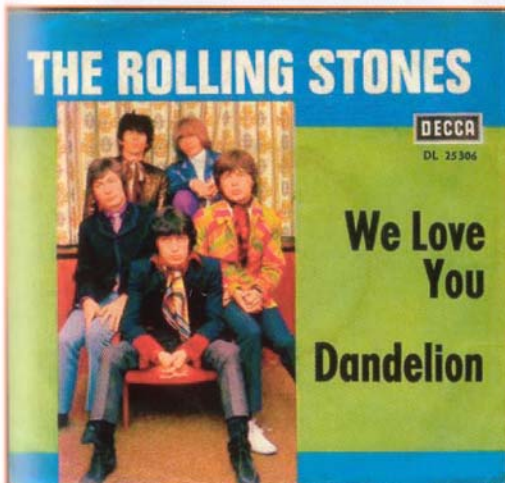

Original Label: Yellow "Klingende Post" **Comments:** For once, two Stones-songs were featured on a "Klingende Post"-EP. **Something Happened To Me Yesterday** was a "BETWEEN THE BUTTONS" LP track. The EP cover is depicted on page 174, second row on the left.

Comments: Two variations of the unique cover exist. It is the second one, with the A-side title printed in black, which is far more common.

This was the first Stones single that was originally released with the new red Decca labels that featured the boxed Decca logo in black.

Comments: This single appeared with three variations of the same cover. A white line was drawn between the songtitles on the first variation. That was changed to a black line for a very rare second variation and the line

"went missing" altogether on a third and final version. The titles now also appeared in a different lettering and the DECCA-logo was printed onto Mick's shirt. While these little differences doesn't really matter to the average Stones fan, they sure are of great importance to die-hard collectors
